November 4, 2008 - Sample Ballot

ABSENTEE BALLOT DEADLINE - Voted Absentee Ballots may be dropped off at any designated Early Voting Site that is operational prior to Election Day.

Absentee Ballots may not be dropped off at the polls. If a voter decides to vote at the polls, the absentee ballot needs to be cancelled by the poll worker and the voter will be issued a replacement

Voted Absentee Ballots must be received at the Supervisor of Elections office in DeLand by 7 p.m. on Election Day in order to be counted.

EARLY VOTING - Beginning October 20, 2008, and ending November 1, 2008, Volusia County registered voters may go to any one of five (5) sites in the county and cast their ballot prior to the General Election. laration of Rights Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to delete provisions authorizing the Legislature to regulate or prohibit the ownership real property by aliens ineligible for citizenship

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE I, NEW SECTION

Florida Marriage Protection

This amendment protects marriage as the legal union of only one man and one woman as husband and wife and provides that no other legal union that is treated as marriage or the substantial equivalen hereof shall be valid or recognized The direct financial impact this amendme will have on state and local governme revenues and expenditures cannot be etermined, but is expected to be minor O YES
